2♠ normally shows 4♠-5♥. It may be 5♠-4♥ or 5♠-5♥. Non vul. we can have 4-4. The strength is 3-10 HCP. Vul. we are normally quite sound.

Resp: 2/3/4 M = NAT to play. 2NT = relay: 3♣=max 4-5 or min 5-5 with a singleton, 3♦ = relay. 3♦=min 5-5 with a void - 3♥ = relay, 3♥=min 4-5, 3♠=max 5-5 with a singleton - 3NT = relay, 3NT=max 5-5 with a void - 4♣ = relay.

<2>

WEAK 2♥/♠. It may be 5-card or 6-card. VUL we have a good suit.

RESP: 2♥-2♠ = relay 2♠-2NT = relay.

1. step 5-card maximum and balanced or minimum and any singleton (relay asks)
2. step 5-card minimum and balanced or maximum and any singleton (relay asks)
3. step 6-card minimum with any singleton (relay asks)
4. step 6-card minimum and balanced
5. step 6-card maximum and balanced
6. step 6-card maximum with short ♣
7. step 6-card maximum with short ♦
8. step 6-card maximum with short OM

Major raises: 1M-2M=3card 7-9 1M-2NT=3+card FG 1M-3♣=4card 7-9 1M-3♦=4card 9-11 1M-3M=4card 0-6

Inverted minor raises: After 1m-2m: with 11-14 we show a singleton. With 15+ we relay to ask for a singleton. Without singletons we bid 3m or 2NT/3NT. 1m-3m=PRE 0-6/8

If our 1NT opening is doubled by 2nd hand and this double shows strength we play:

REDBL= one suited hand - opener is asked to bid 2♣.

2♣ = at least 4-4 in ♣ and ♦ or ♥ and ♠.

2♦ = at least 4-4 in ♦ and ♥

2♥/♠ = 5+card - some values - competition at 3 level is possible.

1M-2NT = supp.3+card FG

RESP: 3♣= 1)any void. 2)15-17 bal. 3)18-19 bal. 3♦=relay

3♦ = any singleton - minimum hand. 3♥=relay

3♥ = any singleton - maximum hand. 3♠=relay

3♠ = 7-2-2-2 any strength. 3NT=relay

3NT=11-14 bal.

Usefull space principle (USP) is used by the defensive responder if 3rd hand bids pass or 1NT or DBL(negative). If it's not possible to use then we bid natural and then a new suit is F.

All replies at the two level in a suit below the overcall is transfer - if:

- the opening was at the one level (some exceptions at the two level)
- the overcall is not a jumpshift
- 3rd hand bids (pass, DBL-NEG, 1NT)

NB: USP is also used after 1X-2Y-2X-? and 1X-1Y-3X-?

Smith = high card shows interest for the lead. (from both hands)

Lavinthal = In standard situations.

Suit preference = in a suit bid by us.

high even = low suit - high odd = high suit.

1♠-1NT,2♣ = at least 16+. Resp. bids: 2♦ = nothing to show, 2♥ = 5-card+ in ♥,  
2♠ = 3-card 5-7, 2NT = both m, 3X = good 6-card.  
(exception 1♠-1NT,2♣-2x,2♠ = 11-15 ♠ and ♣)

If opp. bid after our 1NT opening we use Rubensohl. 2NT=transfer to 3♣. Any new  
suit is then invitational. 3X is transfer - weak or FG.

Danish asking bid. Responses on an asking bid:

1. step no ctrl. or ctrl and no ace.
2. step ctrl. and 1 or 4 aces.
3. step ctrl. and 2 or 5 aces.
4. step ctrl. and 3 aces or void and 0 ace.
5. step void and 1 or 4 aces a.s.o.
